

(Capt. W. R. Ballard biography: Ballard Pool)

Playground name is assumed from the district which had been the town of BALLARD, named in honor of Capt. William R. Ballard who had platted the townsite in 1882. The town was incorporated in 1889 and officially named in 1890; annexed to Seattle in 1907.

In 1889 W.R. Ballard built a small shingle mill turning out a record \$70,000 worth of rough

timber; became the Seattle Cedar & Lumber Mfg. Co. center of the fishing industry is Salmon Bay, and Ballard fishermen supply salmon, halibut and herring to all parts of the world. Lumber, fishing & shipbuilding built Ballard.
