


Named in 1908 to honor 3rd President (1801-09)

Course in 1865]

18 hole = 96 Ac. [Park total = 137.4 Ac.]

"park + parkway purposes," Purch. price another site for cemetery)
Opened for play in 1915. (5/12)

1st MUNICIPAL Course in Seattle.
Second course opened in 1910.
Site was originally State School Land; 235 ac. 11,715
purch. by city in 1898 for reservoir + cemetery (site
purch. elsewhere 1911). City stockade, park nursery +
greenhouse built - used until 1928. Prisoners grubbed site.
18 hole course originally designed (1911/1925) by The
Olmsted Bros. (Boston); opened for play 1915.
Joe Jefferson of England was the first Pro-
1915-1944; resided in house now used as Bowlers'
Clubhouse. (Refer to P.F. sheet for BOWLERS)
Sherwood Gillespie is honored with the drinking
fountain (golfer) in front of clubhouse: "father of
municipal golf in Seattle." Gillespie (1853-1912)
came to Seattle 1896, mgr. of Mutual Life Ins. Co.*
Statue + plaques by Max Nielsen of Denmark was
commissioned by Dr. Frank L. Shaw and friends.
Born in N.Y. of Scotch (Golf) lineage first entered Dry
Goods business. Agent for purch. of Mutual Life Bldg.
Pioneer Bldg) - "most elegant office in N.W." Founded (one-dish
Independent Telephone Co. * ("most successful")
