


Snoqualmie St. is from the Indian word for "moon" - Snoqualmi - from whence came the legendary ancestors of the tribe (legend of "The Changer"). The ancestral village was on the banks of the Snoqualmie Mt. River. Patkanim was Chief during Pioneer Days and is patron chief of Everett. The Indian trail thru Snoqualmie Pass was used by Hudson Bay Co. trappers and in 1854 Lt. Abiel Tinkham, accompanied by an Indian guide, established the feasibility of a wagon road: a portion of which is identified near the Denny Creek Camp @ Snoqualmie Pass.
