

Upon request of the Board of Park Commissioners, the Leschi School and community  
thought suggestions for a name for the playground; the school children recommended  
naming the memory of an 8 yr. old: Peppi Braxton, a first grader who was a favorite  
in his playmates and admired by his teachers. He was killed in a bicycle-automobile  
accident in 1971, at S. Charles + Yakima Pl. S. (near his home.)

The playground siting is the result of community efforts begun in 1953 with a Petition  
for "childrens' facilities" in Frink Park. The Planning Commission reviewed the Request  
and, even though the Neighborhood was greatly deficient in playground space, they  
recommended against Frink Park as not providing adequate space, urging the possible  
expansion of Leschi School site, which became the site selected by the Community for the  
Forward Thrust Project.
