RE: Union Waivers of Seattle's Paid Sick and Safe Time Regulations

In September 2011 the Seattle City Council passed legislation¹ requiring employers with more than four full-time equivalent employees to provide paid sick time and paid safe time to employees who work within the Seattle city limits for more than 240 hours. However, the ordinance provides that

The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to any employees covered by a bona fide collective bargaining agreement to the extent that such requirements are expressly waived in the collective bargaining agreement in clear and unambiguous terms.

Section 4 of the ordinance requires the Office of City Auditor to provide an assessment of the use of explicit waivers of the ordinance's requirements in collective bargaining agreements. This memo provides our assessment of the use of such waivers in collective bargaining agreements.

We identified 69 unions representing employees we believed to be eligible for Seattle's Paid Sick and Safe Time (PSST) regulations (Ordinance Number: 123698). We were able to speak with representatives of all 69 of the unions to ask if they had opened negotiations about Seattle's PSST regulations as allowed by the ordinance. Table 1 below shows the outcome of our contacts. See Attachment 1 for a full list of the unions we identified.

Explanations given by unions for their actions. Table 2 below shows explanations provided by some of the unions for their actions. Several unions reported waiving the requirement because their agreements already provided leave benefits that exceeded the ordinance requirements. Some of these unions were able to use the waiver to obtain additional value (i.e., additional money or other benefits). This occurred in at least one instance because of a union's willingness to waive the legislation's record-keeping and reporting requirements.
