Seattle City Light's Multifamily Retrofit Program offers building owners incentives for window retrofits, ENERGY STAR® rated exterior door installation and insulation upgrades. Properties with at least 50% of units whose residents are enrolled in our Utility Discount Program qualify for ductless heat pump and connected thermostat incentives as well as increased door, window, and insulation incentives. These incentives reduce your total project costs and help make upgrades more affordable.

Benefits

Upgrading your building's windows, doors, heating system, thermostat, and/or insulation can greatly improve your energy performance, protect occupant comfort and health, and enhance your building's durability and resilience. Working with City Light can help cover a significant portion of the cost of these upgrades!

Additional benefits include:

- Lower your energy costs
- Qualify for additional local, state, and federal incentives
- · Improve the look and feel of your building
- · Align with local and state performance standards

Eligibility Criteria

- · Must be a Seattle City Light electricity customer
- The building must be an apartment building, condominium, retirement community, and/or cooperative
- The building must have five or more units and have permanently installed electric heat (baseboard, wall unit, furnace, heat pump) as its primary heat source

Seattle City Light is now offering income-qualified incentives for our multifamily customers!

Process for Multifamily Incentives

Before starting work or purchasing equipment, you must sign a participation agreement with City Light to qualify for incentives.

Apply to Program and provide City Light with proposed scope of work for upgrades

APPLICATION

City Light reviews proposal, estimates savings potential, conducts site visit, if necessary, and offers participation agreement to customer

REVIEW

INSTALLATION

Install upgrades and provide product documentation and project costs to City Light **VERIFICATION**

Coordinate with City Light for onsite verification of installation Finalize project close-out with City Light; payment is sent to customer within 45 days of customer's signature

PAYMENT

The Multifamily Retrofit Application is <u>available online</u>. Once your application is received, all project applicants will work directly with an Energy Management Analyst to provide the necessary project details.
