



DECLARATION OF NON-RESPONSIBILITY

Traffic camera enforcement program

This Declaration may not be used by employers to transfer responsibility to their employees. According to the law, a vehicle registered to an employer that is driven by an employee remains in the “care, custody, and control” of the employer. The employer is responsible for payment of the infraction penalty. Like a parking infraction, an employee may take responsibility for the traffic camera infraction by submitting payment directly to the Court or by requesting a hearing in the driver’s name. **Only the registered owner(s) of the vehicle cited in the notice of infraction may submit a Declaration.**

Infractions generated by traffic cameras will not appear on any Department of Licensing driver record.

If the infraction is not paid, it will go to a collection agency.
