PROCEEDINGS

Respondents' Motion to Stay Proceedings:

Respondents (collectively "Respondents") Frank Colacurcio, Jr. ("Colacurcio Jr."), Frank Colacurcio, Sr. ("Colacurcio Sr.") and Marsha Furfaro ("Furfaro") move to stay the proceedings in this matter until completion of the criminal trial pending against them in the King County Superior Court. The Executive Director of the Seattle Ethics and Elections Commission ("Director") does not oppose the motion. The motion, and the Director's agreement with the motion, is based on the following:

- 1. Pursuant to Rule 2.10 of the Seattle Ethics and Elections Commission Administrative Rules ("Rule"), the Commission has authority to stay proceedings upon a showing of good cause.
- Each of the Respondents is currently facing criminal prosecution in the King
 County Superior Court. The prosecution alleges that the Respondents violated RCW 40.16.030.
 - 3. As part of that criminal prosecution, the King County Prosecutor's Office

("KCPA") conducted hearings before a Special Inquiry Judge, as permitted by RCW ch. 10.29. Pursuant to an order issued by the King County Superior Court, the KCPA provided materials from those hearings ("SIJ Materials") to the Director.

- 4. The materials provided by the KCPA comprise a substantial portion of the discovery materials provided by the Director to counsel for the Respondents in this matter. The Director anticipates that a significant portion of the evidence he intends to submit at the hearing on the merits in this matter will be based upon the SIJ Materials.
- 5. Counsel for the Director has spoken with the trial prosecutor in the criminal matter and with John Wolfe, who represents Respondent Colacurcio Jr. in both this matter and in the criminal proceeding. Both the prosecutor and Mr. Wolfe estimate that the criminal matter will be set for trial sometime in February 2008.
- 6. By prior agreed order in this matter, the parties are to submit proposed dates for briefing, a hearing on motions, and a hearing on the merits of this case. In the absence of a stay of the proceedings, and considering potential dates, reasonable vacation schedules and the impact of the holiday season, counsel anticipate requesting a hearing on the merits in mid-December 2007 or mid-January 2008.
- 7. Counsel for all parties have reviewed King v. Olympic Pipe Line, 104 Wn.App. 338, 16 P.3d 45 (2000) and the procedural status of this matter and the criminal prosecution. Based on that review, the Director does not oppose the Respondents' motion to stay the proceedings in this matter pending completion of the trial in the criminal matter.
