

1. Meet next to The Seated IV statue outside the northeast entrance to the Hans Rosling Center for Population Health.








Image of The Seated IV

Parking Information

Central Plaza Garage (beneath Red Square) is the closest to the tour site. Ensure that you stop either at the garage gatehouse to purchase a permit before parking or use the self-serve pay-by-phone option. Do this <u>prior</u> to the tour. Visitor parking is on levels C2, C3 and C4. The hourly rate is \$4.00.

COVID-19 protocol for visitors

All attendees 12 and older must provide proof of vaccination or proof of a negative COVID-19 test taken within 72 hours of the tour. These documents will be verified upon arrival at the tour meeting point.

The following documents will be accepted:

- CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card or photo of the card
- Documentation of vaccination from a health-care provider or electronic health record
- State immunization information system record
- For anyone vaccinated outside the United States, a reasonable equivalent of any of the above
- Results of a negative COVID-19 PCR or antigen test that is FDA-approved and done within 72 hours of the event. (Note: At-home tests cannot be accepted.)

Additionally, masks are required for all visitors at all times, inside buildings and in crowded outdoor spaces.
