7	<p>Sub-Committees</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff reviewed the four committees identified at the December 2024 meeting. Committee focus areas include: Health, Safety and Gun Violence, Education, and Civic Engagement. • Members self-selected into small groups around the committee topics to identify two topics of interest to the commissioners. • In the area of Health, commissioners identified Mental Health and Reproductive Health as top priorities. Specifically, Commissioners are interested promoting access to mental health services, reproductive health services, and public education around reproductive justice issues. Commissioners identified the importance of increasing public awareness of existing resources through their role of public commissioners. • In the area of Safety and Gun Violence, Commissioners focused on School Gun Violence and Student Education. Commissioners discussed the need for physical improvements to educational facilities, and increase public awareness and education among young people about violence, drug use, and other health and safety topics. • In the area of Education, Commissioners identified Educational Access and Awareness as topic priorities. This includes access to advanced courses, funding, school supplies, and college and career readiness. Commissioners also discussed the opportunity to increase public awareness of existing resources through the school district and city such as libraries and other public services and programs, and the differences in access among public and private education systems. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ One specific policy issue arose for Running Start student access restrictions challenges in public school facilities that have limited student access to study space and printers. 	50 min

Commissioners prioritized creating more access and accessible through seminars, summits, etc. As a means of youth civic engagement.
