### Required Program Components (1 of 2)

- 6
- Minimum of 120 hours of total programming
- All programs must provide academic instruction and enrichment activities
- Minimum of 10 hours of academic instruction per week focused on:
  - Reading/Writing
  - Math
  - Math combined with Science
  - English Language Acquisition
  - Social-Emotional, Physical, Language, Literacy, Cognitive, and Mathematics domains in Teaching Strategies GOLD (for students entering kindergarten)

#### Required Program Components (2 of 2)

- Enrichment activities should provide engaging opportunities to build important academic skills and to foster other skills that support learning such as collaboration and creative problem solving
- These activities may expose students to topics including:
  - Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM)
  - Visual and Performing Arts
  - College/Career Readiness
  - PreK to elementary school transition
  - Elementary to middle school transition
  - Middle school to high school transition
