Topic:

Search Warrant Exception

Summary of the Management Action:

Allegation that employee violated Department policy by effectuating a warrantless entry into the subject's residence based on a Non-Emergent Detention order.

Original Recommendation:

Provide a training update to the Patrol Bureau concerning Non-Emergent Detention orders. Draw the distinction between emergent detentions, Emergent Detention Orders, and Non-Emergent Detention Orders and describe the contours and legal parameter of each. Remind officers that, without additional information supporting community caretaking or exigent circumstances, these orders to not permit a warrantless entry into an otherwise constitutionally protected space.

Action Taken:

Language was added to the Crisis Intervention Policy 16.110-POL-5(8) providing clarity regarding using an ITA as authority to enter a constitutionally protected area. Directive 19-00021 was issued on August 1, 2019 outlining the changes that had been made to the policy. Whenever a Directive is issued, all employees are notified and are required to review the directive. A short quiz must be passed to ensure the directive was read and understood. Directive 19-00021 contained a question regarding the language added to the policy regarding this issue, which the department views as a training update.
