Updated Draft Guiding Principles



Version 3 of Draft Guiding Principles

- Supporting and uplifting affected communities
- Adaptive and creative infrastructure to protect and accommodate
- Equitable benefits for residents and businesses
- Promoting racial equity and a thriving economy
- Feasible infrastructure that prioritizes nature-based solutions

Decision-Making Frameworks



Purpose

- Advisory Group members will make recommendations on Resilience District solutions
- How will we decide which recommendations to make?
- How actively will we use the Guiding Principles and evaluation criteria we are creating in these 101 sessions?



Democratic Voting



What is it?

- One person has one vote
- Majority leads
- No single individual is responsible for the decision



How would this work for us?

• Each Group member votes on the solution they feel is best



Democratic Voting

Pros

- Good for narrowing down options
- Each person is heard

Cons

- Deciders may not feel ownership of the choice if what they voted for wasn't selected
- Challenging to consider nuances of complex solutions or discussions



Consensus



What is it?

- Everyone must agree
- Requires openness and compromise



How would this work for us?

 Facilitated group conversation until we all agree on the same best solution



Consensus

Pros

- Satisfies all members
- Helps build trust
- Encourages open conversation

Cons

- Can be very time consuming
- "First idea best idea" syndrome
- Requires **everyone** to agree
- Indirectly looks at nuances, complexities, etc.



Rubric ** OUR RECOMMENDATION **



What is it?

- A tool that describes the pieces of a decision and allows members to judge quality along those pieces
- Can include criteria for what's scored as high, medium, or low



How would this work for us?

 Group members can score different solutions along the Guiding Principles and Criteria for each work topic



Rubric

Pros

- Helps avoid conflicts of interest
- Encourages direct assessment of values or priorities
- Encourages transparency in decision-making
- Gives more information and backing when making the case with City decision-makers

Cons

- People can score very differently
- Can be complicated
- Does not require everyone to agree
