GREEN LAKE AQUATIC VEGETATION MANAGEMENT PLAN DEVELOPMENT

Come to the First Public Meeting to Learn About the Development of an Aquatic Vegetation Management Plan

Green Lake and Green Lake Park are popular recreation venues for the city and both are managed by Seattle Parks and Recreation (SPR). Since the 1980s, SPR has managed aquatic plants due to finding Eurasian watermilfoil (Myriophyllum spicatum) and Brazilian elodea (Egeria densa) in the lake.

In this project, an Integrated Aquatic Vegetation Management Plan will define aquatic plant management goals and strategies for Green Lake. Both public input and a steering committee composed of aquatic plant specialists will help develop the plan. In September a draft plan will be complete and presented at a second public meeting. The final plan will be completed by the end of 2024.
