


### Welcome to Part 2!

## The Submission Requirements

This is an opportunity to show us how your vision and concepts take form. The submitted materials should demonstrate development of the concepts from Part 1 and show how your ideas translate into design. Focus on communicating the important aspects of the design and let us know what site features and components are needed to successfully and meaningfully realize your proposed vision.

### Submit the following by the deadline:

**A) Site plan:** This should show proposed upgrades with key cimensions, plantings, materials, hard and soft surfaces.

**B)** Sketches or renderings: These should convey the key elements of your design, including any details, dimensions, and/or materials that help get the developed concepts across. Think: What components are needed to bring the vision to life?

**[Optional] Additional supporting exhibits:** Teams may submit any other exhibits/diagrams that help convey the important aspects of the design.

# The Evaluation Criteria

### Development of the concept in a way that demonstrates:

- Creativity
- Respect of the neighborhood history
- · Understanding of and aspirations for existing community
- · Understanding of project and site feasibility

Note that all criteria from Part 1 still apply
