Code Issue:

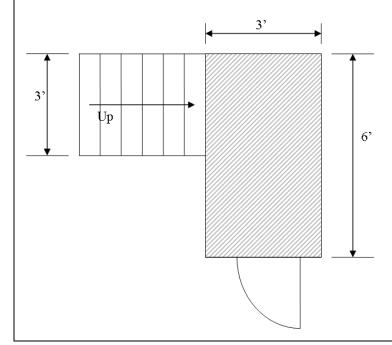
Within a dwelling unit, under what conditions does DPD consider a stair penthouse a story?

Interpretation:

A stair penthouse within a dwelling unit is not considered a story when the following conditions are met:

- The enclosed floor area at the top of the stairs is not greater than the larger of 25 square feet or the minimal area necessary to provide a code-complying landing for the stair and a door;
- The stair penthouse provides access to a roof deck for the dwelling unit; and
- The area at the top of the stairs does not have any furnishings, fixtures, built in shelves or appliances.

See the following common arrangements that satisfy this interpretation:

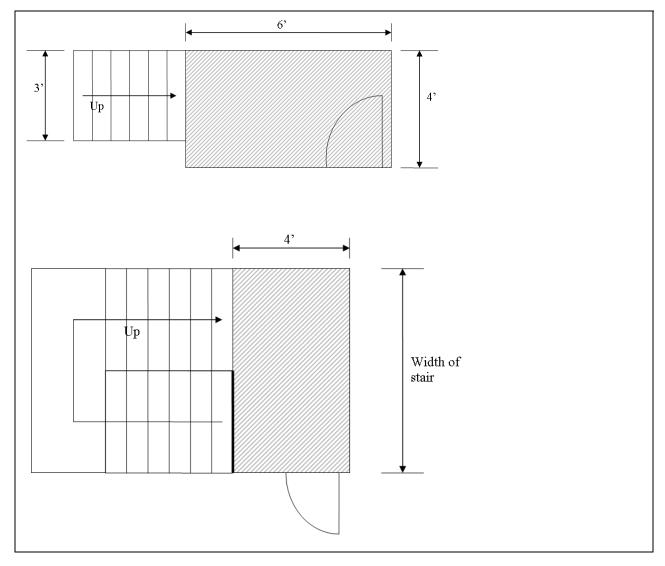
