Seattle's Sharps Collection Program

We provide safe disposal of "sharps" (syringes, needles, and lancets). This includes removal of sharps from public property within 24 hours, and securing dozens of sharps disposal boxes across Seattle.

How Do I Safely Handle Sharps?

Do not pick them up with your bare hands.

Use a glove and tongs, shovel, or broom and dustpan.

Place used sharps and syringes in a manufactured sharps container (purchase at pharmacies) or a hard plastic bottle or closed container. Make sure the lid fits tightly and tape it shut. If you use a plastic pop bottle, label it: "SHARPS, DO NOT RECYCLE." Take it to one of the listed sharps disposal box locations inside of the brochure.



Where to Dispose of Sharps in Seattle



Sharps are not allowed in the garbage

because they can injure residents, garbage collection workers, and other employees that handle the garbage. Always use a designated sharps disposal container at a City provided drop-off location for used sharps.

Sharps Disposal Box Locations are Distributed Across Seattle

The drop-off locations include places where reports of sharps on have been relatively high. They are in visible areas on public property. Look for two types of sharps disposal box locations.



Large, Mailbox-sized Bins Available 24/7



Small Single Sharps Disposal Bins
