#### **Discussion Included:**

- Adopted Transit Communities policy and how it will be incorporated into the upcoming drafts of the Urban Village Element;
- Confirm Commission support for removal of "growth targets" and instead using "growth estimates" as well as eliminating growth estimates for areas other than Urban Centers;
- Question on how broad transit is defined and whether or not street car was represented; and
- Recap on Task Force Urban Village/Transit Communities
  - Urban Village Policy 5 now incorporates LU273 and LU274 from adopted Transit Communities Policy
  - Urban Village Policy 6 now incorporates LU275 from adopted Transit Communities Policy
  - Urban Village Policy 6 now incorporates LU278 from adopted Transit Communities Policy
  - Land Use Policy 8 now incorporates LU277 from adopted Transit Communities Policy
  - LU276 and LU279 are currently not incorporated or could be stronger

### Staff Recommendations: Comprehensive Plan: Key Land Use Element Questions

**Question #1 (Posed by DPD staff)** - Would removing policies that discourage the demolition of residences might increase displacement and further reduce affordable housing stock?

#### **Discussion Included:**

- Confirm Commission support for preservation of safe and habitable multifamily units and not just affordable;
- Concern that a focus on displacement may inadvertently restrict supply and overall the housing picture is not helped by overly restricting supply;
- Concern that historical preservation is becoming overly restrictive and could have an adverse effect on housing prices;

# Letter regarding SPC review of the Comprehensive Plan Update:

- Presentation Included:
- Commission intends to write a letter that will present three items they believe are required for proper review of the Comprehensive Plan overall. 1. The Comprehensive Plan Introduction; 2. How the Core Values will be incorporated into the introduction and each individual Element; and 3. A graphical outline that shows how the plan will be laid out and how each Element will be situated within the plan.
- Discussion Included: General support for the letter as a crucial to the review of the Comprehensive Plan.
